

Cardiology Advanced Imaging Fellowship Program Application Instructions

Position Details: The University of Washington School of Medicine Division of Cardiology is accepting applications for the non-ACGME Cardiology Advanced Imaging Fellowship program. This is a full-time (100% FTE) 12-month appointment available July 1 of each academic year.

The major purpose of this fellowship training is to prepare individuals for careers in academic medicine. It is anticipated that at the end of their training, these highly qualified and skilled individuals will be able to launch on a productive research and clinical career. It is expected that fellows will achieve level III certification in echocardiography and either be eligible to become directors of echocardiography laboratories and/or to work as cardiac imagers and researchers in academic medical centers.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the following qualifications to be eligible for appointment to this fellowship program:

1. Successful completion of ACGME training in Cardiovascular Disease (board-eligible/board-certified)
2. Graduation from a medical school in the United States or Canada, accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME); or,
3. Graduation from a college of osteopathic medicine in the United States accredited by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA); or,
4. US Citizenship or Permanent Residency
5. Graduation from a medical school outside of the United States or Canada, and meeting one of the following additional qualifications:
 - a. Holds a currently valid certificate from the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates prior to appointment, or,
 - b. Holds a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine in a US licensing jurisdiction in his or her current ACGME specialty/subspecialty program or,
 - c. Has graduated from a medical school outside the United States and has completed a Fifth Pathway program provided by an LCME-accredited medical school.

Applications will be accepted through September 30, 2017. Interviews will be held in November/December 2017. *We will contact you if you have been selected to interview.*

1. Curriculum Vitae including list of publications
2. One-Page Personal Statement describing why you want to train at the UW, your future career goals, and your research experience (500 word maximum)
3. Copy of USMLE transcripts – Steps 1-3
4. Copy of Medical School Transcripts
5. ECFMG Certificate and Visa status if applicable (note that Permanent Residency or US Citizenship is an eligibility requirement)

Please indicate in the subject line if you are applying for July 1, 2018 or July 1, 2019.

The following must be sent directly from the letter writers in PDF format:

1. Letter of support from you cardiology program director
2. Two additional confidential letters of recommendation – sent directly from letter writers
